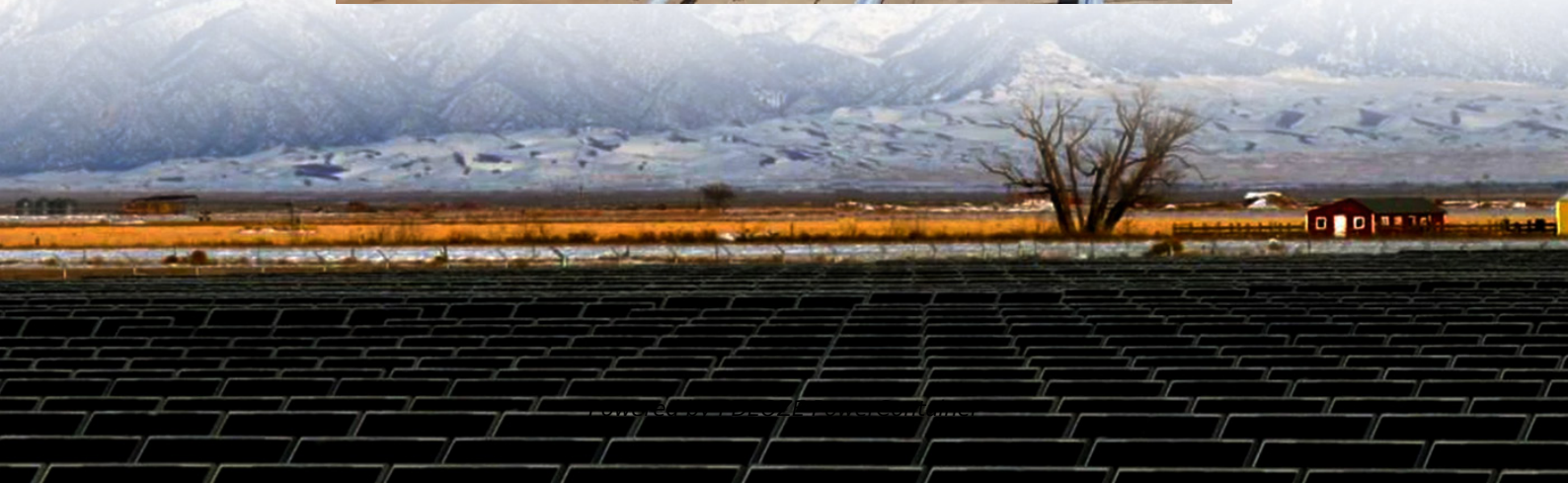

Standalone 5G is coming to Central America with the help of rival Nordic cellular vendors. Ericsson just signed a deal with operator Liberty to deploy a pure 5G standalone core in Costa Rica, which the Swedish vendor claims as a first for Central America — although that's debatable.
