Mauritius energy storage power station budget



Overview

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The Mauritius government's 2025 budget underscores a firm commitment to sustainable development through a strong focus on renewable energy initiatives. The plan is designed to enhance energy efficiency and reduce the nation's dependency on fossil fuels, positioning Mauritius as a leader in the.

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In 2024, renewable energy contribution in the electricity mix stood at 18.2% (621 GWh), or 41.8% short of our international commitment of 60% contribution of renewable energy in the mix by 2030. The 2025-2026 budget enunciated a series of bold measures being implemented to accelerate our energy.

In its 2021-2022 budget speech, the government announced plans to increase the use of renewable sources of energy for electricity generation to 60 percent, phase out the use of coal, and increase energy efficiency by 10 percent, all by 2030. The government also reviewed the Renewable Energy Roadmap.

On June 12th, Linyang Energy announced that a consortium formed by its Linyang Power Services and China Water Resources and Electric Power Corporation has successfully won the bid for the Mauritius government's grid side energy storage project, with a bid amount of 24.9889 million US dollars. Does Mauritius need a battery energy storage system?

Mauritius aims to increase the share of renewable energy sources in its energy mix, which leads to fluctuating power injection. To reduce this fluctuation from variable renewable energy sources, the installation of Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) is required.

Does Mauritius have a waste-to-energy project?

Mauritius produces about 500,000 tons of solid waste per year and its only landfill site is nearly full. In 2016, CEB (Mauritian utility company) issued a Request for Proposals for a 24 MW waste-to-energy project. Accordingly.

How does Mauritius generate energy?

Mauritius generates energy through various means including wind farms, solar energy, biomass, wave, and waste-to-energy projects. Currently, bagasse (sugarcane waste) is the leading source, contributing 13.3 percent to the renewable energy generation. Mauritius derives other renewable electricity from hydro, wind, landfill gas, and solar.

How will Mauritius transition to a low carbon economy?

Mauritius is transitioning to a low carbon economy, with the Central Electricity Board (CEB) installing the first grid-scale Battery Energy Storage System (BESS). This is the first of its kind in Mauritius and enables high capacity storage of renewable energy in the grid.

Does Mauritius use solar energy?

Mauritius has an attractive potential for solar energy, with an average annual solar radiation value of some 6 kWh/m²/day. Solar photovoltaic (PV) energy is an option due to the almost year-round intensive sunlight. To achieve the target of 60 percent renewable energy by 2030, Mauritius has commissioned six more solar farms.

What is Mauritius' long term energy strategy?

The Government of Mauritius' Long Term Energy Strategy 2009-2025 aims to

increase the share of renewable energy in our energy mix to 35% by 2025. This includes reducing the country's dependence on coal and heavy oil for electricity generation.

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In line with the government's vision to promote renewable energy in the electricity mix to 60% by 2030, a 20 MW grid scale battery energy storage system (BESS), has been inaugurated in the ...
